Scottish Wildcats

could be a Wildcat, a Bee, a Sea Anemone...anything.

1. **Discuss:** Talk to a friend or a family member about your animal. What colour is it? What does it look like? Where does it live? What does it eat? Does it have fur, feathers, or scales.
2. **Think:** Decide now what animal/insect mask you will make.
3. **Plan:** Try to find a picture of your animal, or check out some of the pictures below and do a quick drawing of the eyes, nose, mouth, whiskers – remember you are making a mask so try to make the size of the mask the size of your own head. Have a look at these videos to help you.

Rabbit Mask – you may need adult help. Remember if you don't have coloured card/paper, make a collage colour from old magazines and stick it to recycled card (cereal box etc.)

4. **Prepare:** Find a place to work (check with an adult), cover tables with paper or an old sheet/tablecloth to keep things clean! Collect your pencils, pens, cardboard, ribbon, junk, glue, scissors etc.
5. **Create:** Use your own ideas, the YouTube Lessons and/or adapt them to make a really creative animal/insect mask.
6. **Share:** Take a picture of your work and share it with your teacher, friends, and family – send your picture in for our Breadalbane Virtual Gallery.

You are going to make a mask of an animal or insect of your choice. Perhaps choose an animal you would like to find out more about...a zebra, a Lemur, or a Tree Frog

1. **Discuss:** Talk to a friend or a family member about your animal. What have you discovered about the animal – its habitat,
2. **Think:** Decide now what animal/insect mask you will make.
3. **Plan:** Try to find a picture of your animal, or check out some of the pictures below and do a quick drawing of the eyes, nose, mouth, whiskers – remember you are making a mask so try to make the size of the mask the size of your own head. Have a look at these videos to help you.

Animal Masks – card, re-cycled junk – be creative and adaptive use anything, old clothes, paper plates, card, ribbon, paper etc.

Further Activities

- Pretend you are the animal and describe your day, in character – making animal sounds and a cartoon voice!
- Create another mask, give your animals different personalities – happy/sad/naughty/helpful..then make up a short mime or a verbal role play puppet show! Take a video and share it with family and friends.
- Research – find out more about your animal, where it lives, what it eats; find out if it is an Endangered Species and if so, why?

Mask Ideas



Glue recipe

Glue Recipes

There are lots of different ways to make homemade glue. The simplest glue is made from a paste of flour and water. You can also make cornflour (corn-starch) or milk glue. All are quick, easy, non-toxic, and great for making paper crafts including paper-mâché projects and are good for making with children.

Basic Glue

Ingredients

1 cup of flour

½ a cup of water

1/8 teaspoon of salt

Method: Mix your flour and water in a bowl with a spoon. Blend the mixture until it is as thick as pancake batter. The paste should not be too thick or too drippy.

- If you need more glue, simply double the recipe.
- If you need less glue, start with the amount of flour you will use, then add water, a teaspoon at a time, until it reaches the right consistency.

Note: This glue will not last too long, so make and use.

Lots of other glue recipes here ...even waterproof glue! (Corn-starch is very similar to cornflour in the UK)
