<p>Activity – this is a 2-weeks – 2 lesson project</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Creating an 3D Eco Sculpture (or picture) – an Eco character with a catchy name</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Discuss: Talk to a friend or a family member about how humans affect our planet? What are humans doing that is good? What is happening to animals, plants, the weather and the oceans? 2. Think: How could we help save Planet Earth? Do you want to help our world - humans, forests, animals, plants....? Now think what kind of character you can create - animal/robot etc to help you. Can you make it using the junk/re-cycled materials you have collected? For more ideas for your theme/character have a look at the picture examples below and the Art Lesson Picture Plan. Note: If you have few resources or space, make a tiny model or a 3D picture. 3. Plan: Get all your resources together and your family to help you and make a plan and/or a sketch. Chat about a name for your Eco character e.g. theme - helping the forests – squirrel called Conny (Conny Conifer!) 4. Prepare: Find a place to work – outside is best if you are making a large picture/sculpture (check the resources and place to work with an adult), cover tables with paper or an old sheet/tablecloth to keep things clean! Collect your re-cycled materials, paper, pencils, glue, string, pens and paints. 5. Create: Use the videos clips and the ideas from your family, create a 3D picture or sculpture of an Eco character. Take a video or pictures which you can send in for the Breadalbane Primary Gallery. Don't forget to give you character a name. 6. Develop: Your sculpture might grow and change week by week. You might add more materials, more resources, plants that can grow, change, and adapt your idea etc. 7. Share: Take a picture of your work and share it with your teacher, friends, and family – send your picture in for our Breadalbane Academy website Primary Gallery. <p><u>P4 – 7</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 8. Acrostic Poem: Once you have made your sculpture, work together to make an acrostic poem with an Eco theme, based on your character and what your character can do to help you “Save the Planet”. Take a picture and send it to the school. <p>Don't forget once you are finished with you sculpture please recycle the materials you have used.</p>
<p>Further Activities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a second Eco character sculpture to help your main character, or with a different theme - animals, plants, forest etc. maybe a “mini-me” • Find out (research) how scientists are developing new ways to help feed the world and help the people and creatures that live on the planet – make a poster, a Fact File or a PowerPoint to share your ideas • Adapt your Eco Sculpture by making it a feature in your garden, a living work by growing plants around or in it • In your Learning Jotter write a few sentences inspired by your Eco character and sculpture... “If I could change the world....”
