Dear Parent/Carer

Perth & Kinross Council have revised their attendance guidance taking into account national guidance. This ensures schools are meeting statutory requirements as well as, hopefully, positively impacting pupil attendance levels.

Perth & Kinross Council's Attendance Policy and Guidance states that: ***Excellent attendance at school is important to allow children and young people to fulfil their potential and for them to have the best possible start in life. As an Education Authority, we aspire for 100% attendance for all our children and young people. Perth and Kinross Council are committed to improve attendance and expect attendance of 96% in primary.***

During the recent Quality Improvement Review, our attendance procedures were discussed. Currently our procedures include having discussions or meetings with parents, written communications and working with families, including with support from other agencies. Going forward, procedures will also include more robust use of the PKC Attendance Policy letters. Parents of pupils who had less than 96% attendance over the last year (or, if they joined us during the year, whilst attending Breadalbane Academy) have received letters informing them of the attendance level.

Whilst we are aware that pupils may be absent for many reasons, including illness, absences do impact on progress and educational development which it can be difficult to make up later in life. Excluding occasional holidays and INSET days, pupils have approximately 12 weeks of holidays every year so it is expected that family holidays should be accommodated within the school holidays as much as possible. The table below shows the potential impact of absences.

If you wish to discuss any aspect of attendance or attendance procedures then I will be happy to do so in the new term.

## ATTENDANCE FACTS

Every pupil at our school must have an attendance of 96% in order for them to comply with Perth and Kinross Council regulation. When a child's absence falls below this figure it has a dramatic impact on their learning. The figures below state very clearly the effect absence has on your child's learning.

Attendance during one school year	Equates to school days absent in one school year	Equates to approximate school weeks absent in one school year	Equates to school lessons missed in one school year	Effect of absence on your child's learning
95%	9 days	2 weeks	54 lessons	<b>Watch out! Your child will have gaps in their learning</b>
90%	18 days	4 weeks	108 lessons	
85%	27 days	6 weeks	162 lessons	<b>Danger! It will be difficult for your child to catch up.</b>
80%	36 days	8 weeks	216 lessons	
75%	45 days	10 weeks	270 lessons	<b>It will be almost impossible for your child to catch up.</b>

60%	72 days	14 weeks	432 lessons
